

The Degree of Master of Music (MMus – 120 points)

These regulations must be read in conjunction with the General Regulations for the University.

1. Version

These Regulations came into force on 1 January 2018.

2. Variations

In exceptional circumstances the Amo Matua, Toi Tangata | Executive Dean of Arts or delegate may approve a personal programme of study which does not conform to these Regulations.

3. The structure of the qualification

To qualify for the Degree of Master of Music a student must pass one of:

- (a) MUSI692 MMus Performance, or
- (b) MUSI693 MMus Composition

4. Admission to the qualification

To be admitted to the Master of Music a student must have:

- (a) either
 - i. completed the course for the Degree of Bachelor of Music with Honours with a B Grade Point Average, or
 - ii. been admitted under the Regulations for admission with Academic Equivalent Standing as entitled to enrol for the Degree of Master of Music; and
- (b) been approved as a student for the degree by the Amo Matua, Toi Tangata | Executive Dean of Arts or delegate, on the recommendation of the Head of Music.
- (c) In special cases, the Amo Matua, Toi Tangata | Executive Dean of Arts or delegate will determine the conditions under which a student who does not meet Regulation 4(a) may be admitted.

5. Subjects

The subject for this degree is Music.

6. Time limits

The time limits for this qualification are:

- (a) 12 months full-time, or
- (b) 24 months part-time.
- (c) MUSI692 or 693 must be submitted by such date as may be prescribed by the Amo Matua, Toi Tangata | Executive Dean of Arts or delegate unless an exemption is granted.

7. Transfers of credit, substitutions and cross-credits

This qualification adheres to the Credit Recognition and Transfer Regulations for the University, with no additional stipulations.

8. Progression

This qualification adheres to the General Regulations for the University, with no additional stipulations.

9. Honours, Distinction and Merit

This qualification adheres to the General Regulations for the University and may be awarded with Distinction and Merit.

10. Exit and Upgrade Pathways to other Qualifications

There are no advancing or exit qualifications for this degree.
