

## Get ahead at UC

Te Whare Wānanga o Waitaha | University of Canterbury (UC) offers courses in a range of subjects over summer (November–February).

## Why study over summer?

Summer study gives you an opportunity to get ahead by:

- earning your degree faster
- catching up after taking introductory courses during the year
- · retaking courses
- · spreading your workload
- · improving your academic skills
- picking up prerequisite courses.

If eligible, you can receive Hoto Akoranga StudyLink assistance over summer.

Due to their intensive nature, summer courses are not recommended if you are new to university. The transition courses discussed on the next page are designed for new UC students.

## Application dates & other important dates

For Summer School courses starting in November 2023 (with the occurrence code 23-SU2) you can apply to enrol now. For Summer School courses starting in January 2024 (with the occurrence code 24-SU1), applications open on 1 October 2023.

Applications close on the Official Course Start Date, unless otherwise stated.

The start date, end date, and withdrawal dates for every course are listed on the Course Information page. Put the course code in the search box and select the Summer School occurrence at www.canterbury.ac.nz/study/qualifications-and-courses/ to find the relevant Course Information page.

UC is closed for Christmas on **22 December 2023** and re-opens on **3 January 2024**. Other key university dates are listed at www.canterbury.ac.nz/study/keydates/.

## How to apply

If you are enrolled at UC in 2023, submit a Change of Enrolment in myUC to add SU1 and/or SU2 Summer School course(s). Information on how to submit a Change of Enrolment is available at www.canterbury.ac.nz/enrol/change/.

If you are not enrolled at UC in 2023, submit an Application to Enrol in myUC (myuc.canterbury.ac.nz/). If you have not studied at UC before you will need to create a myUC account first.



#### Fees

Tuition Fees for each Summer School course are listed on the Course Information page. Put the course code in the search box and select the Summer School occurrence at www.canterbury.ac.nz/study/qualifications-and-courses/ to find the relevant Course Information page.

In addition to the course fee, a compulsory Student Services Levy (SSL) is also charged – see www.canterbury.ac.nz/get-started/fees/.

## Workload and expectations

Most summer courses have an intensive teaching format, completing a summer course successfully requires your full commitment. For this reason, we recommend that you take no more than two courses during the summer.

For a manageable workload, we recommend that you spread your courses across the November and January sessions rather than enrolling in two courses in one session.

Due to the timeframes for summer courses, it is often not possible to be as generous with assignment extensions as it is for semester courses.

#### **Transition courses**

The Certificate in University Preparation (CUP) is offered over summer to meet University Entrance; commencing 6 November and finishing in time to start your degree in February 2024.

Alternatively, our Headstart programme is suitable for students who have University Entrance and would like to prepare for a subject. You can pick up a prerequisite course, or refresh knowledge, skills, and confidence if you have been away from study for a while.
