These scholarships celebrate and recognise academic and sporting excellence, leadership, cultural and community involvement, and overcoming of barriers and personal challenges.

HOW TO APPLY:

Research – Browse all available scholarships to find out what's on offer.

2 Check if you qualify – Read through the criteria to see if you are eligible.

3 Check application dates – Scholarship applications open eight weeks before the closing date.

- 4 Prepare your information Think about what you want to include with your application and, if required, who you will use as your referee(s).
 - **5** Complete your application Ensure you submit your information before the closing date.
 - **6** Sit back and wait! The selection process typically takes 6–8 weeks but may take longer. Don't worry we will notify you as soon as a decision has been made.

| Outstanding Impact Scholarship | This prestigious scholarship nurtures high- achieving students via networking and development opportunities to progress their education in innovative areas and make connections to advance their careers. | \$7,500 plus the opportunity to participate in a UC-sponsored networking and development programme. | All prospective first-year undergraduate students who achieved Excellence at NCEA Level 2 or a corresponding level in an equivalent university entrance qualification. |
| Go Waitaha Canterbury | For students who have strong academic potential but are facing challenges in affording university accommodation costs. | \$15,000 towards accommodation costs at a hall of residence recognised by UC and priority consideration for a place in a hall, plus educational outdoor recreational field trips and a personal and professional development programme in the first year of study. | Year 13 or gap year students attending a school and/or living outside the Greater Christchurch area. Applicants must be eligible to receive StudyLink Student Allowance and recipients must be in receipt of a Student Allowance. Dependent on achievement of Merit or higher at NCEA Level 2, or an equivalent university entrance qualification. |
| UC Haupatu Scholarship – for Sports | This scholarship recognises the value of student athletes and sport in general to the wellbeing of UC's community and aims to support top-performing players while they are studying at the University. | \$7,500 towards tuition fees in the first year that fees are payable. | Applicants must be age-group regional and/or national representatives in sporting codes. |
| Empowerment Through Adversity Scholarship | This scholarship recognises and supports students who have faced significant barriers or personal challenges to entering tertiary education. | Tuition fees for up to 135 points of enrolment per annum, plus \$5,000 per annum each year for up to three years, and an opportunity to participate in a bespoke mentoring and development programme and curated opportunities to contribute to UC's Wellbeing programme. | New incoming first-year undergraduate students who have achieved despite significant barriers or personal challenges. (This may include disabled people, or those with chronic health conditions, ongoing mental health challenges or neurodiversity, second chance learners and others who have shown resilience managing their personal circumstances.) |
| UC Kaitoko Māori Scholarship | This scholarship recognises leadership potential, high academic achievement, and involvement in community and cultural activities amongst ākonga students who have whakapapa Māori. | \$7,500 towards tuition fees in the first year that fees are payable, as well as an opportunity to participate in the UC Māori leadership programme, Paihere, and a UC-sponsored general leadership programme. | Prospective first-year Māori undergraduate students who achieved Merit at NCEA Level 2 or a corresponding level in an equivalent university entrance qualification. |
| UC Kaitoko Pacific Scholarship | This scholarship recognises high academic achievement, as well as leadership potential and involvement in Pacific community and/or Pacific cultural activities, amongst intending first-year Pacific students at UC. | \$7,500 towards tuition fees in the first year that fees are payable, as well as an opportunity to participate in a UC-sponsored leadership programme. | Prospective first-year Pacific undergraduate students who achieved Merit at NCEA Level 2 or a corresponding level in an equivalent university entrance qualification. |
| Te Kakau a Māui Scholarship | This scholarship recognises and supports undergraduate students who demonstrate alignment with UC's commitment to producing students who are engaged, empowered, and prepared to make a difference. The scholarship aims to recognise applicants with a demonstrated and significant commitment to creating positive change in the world. | Tuition fees for up to 135 points of enrolment per annum for the duration of a full-time undergraduate degree programme. | Prospective first-year undergraduate students intending to enrol full-time in a programme for a three-year or four-year undergraduate bachelor's degree. Applicants must be eligible to receive StudyLink Student Allowance and recipients must be in receipt of a Student Allowance. |
