## Reporting of Results

Results are provided to schools in Term 4. Results are calculated for each year level.

The school results include an overall percentage, percentage scores for different strands of the various curricula, stanine, descriptive grade, national average and school average. The school results file can be downloaded as a csv file.

Individual student reports are available for download by the school for distribution to parents/caregivers The report outlines a student's performance overall and for each strand compared to the national average and school average. A student's level of completion and accuracy overall and for each strand, is also included.

A certificate is provided for all participating students.

## When will the competition

 be run?The online competitions will be run last 3 weeks of Term 3, at a time suitable to the school. Different classes or groups can participate in the competition at different times during this period to give schools flexibility in running the competition.

## Registration and Costs

The cost per student for each competition is $\$ 9.90$ (inc. GST).

A permission slip/letter for parents and caregivers is available on our website. The letter invites students to participate and includes a tear off entry slip to be returned to the school. The entry fee is to be collected by schools.
